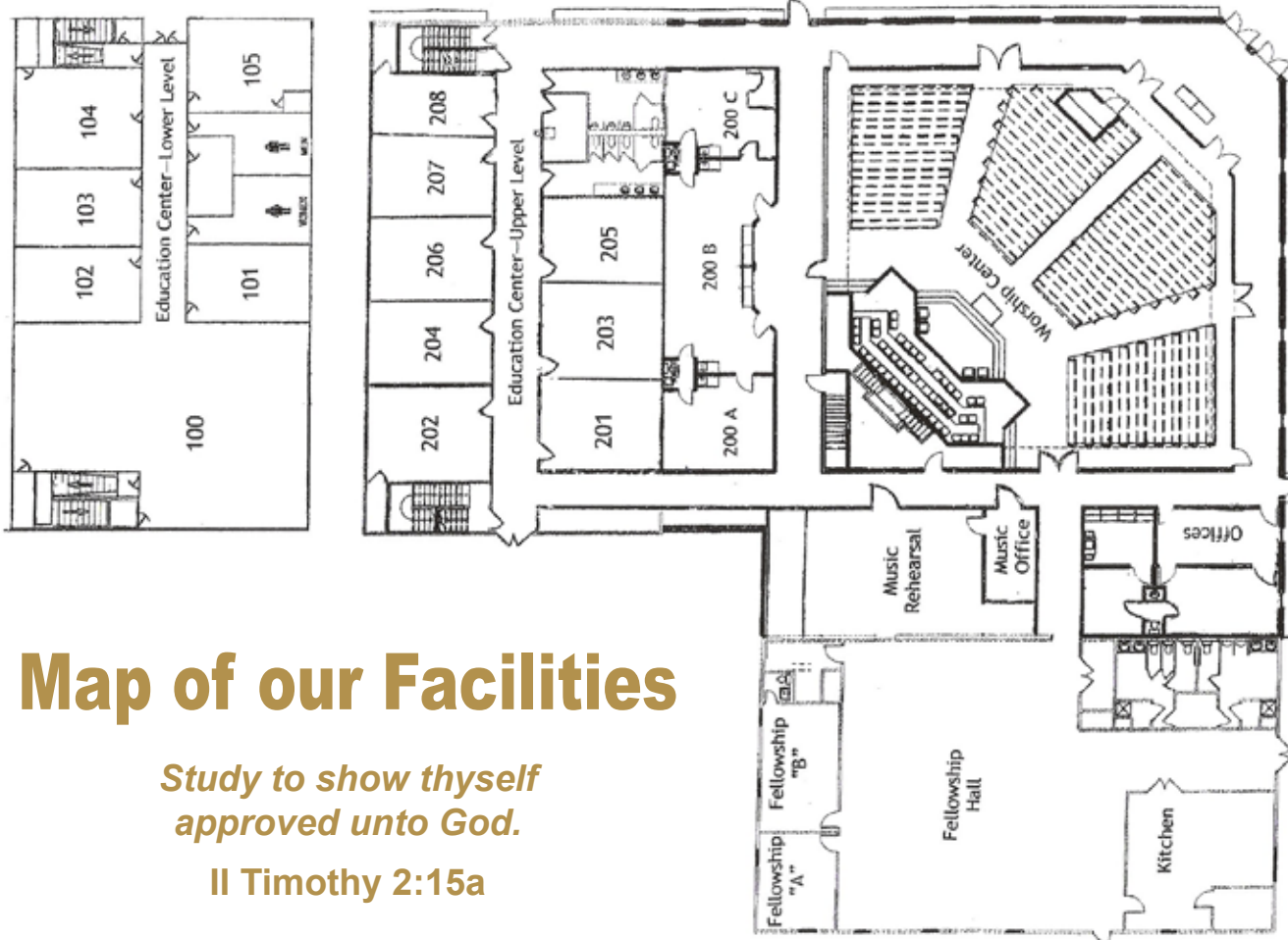

God chose to have four Gospels written instead of one. That may seem like overkill. But Jesus’ life was not ordinary. He is multi-faceted, so it took four different writers to capture what we need to know about His life and ministry on earth. One Gospel would not have been adequate. Matthew, Mark, and Luke are called the synoptics because they cover roughly the same material. But each one is nuanced to present Jesus in a different light. This study will focus first on the depiction of Christ in each of the synoptics. Taking time to understand how each Gospel presents Christ is important. That is part of sound hermeneutics. The study will then combine all three synoptic Gospels in a presentation of the one story of Christ in a somewhat chronological manner beginning with His birth and ending with His resurrection and ascension.
